For example, imagine your uncle just made cookies. You say: I want a cookie!(You want any one of the cookies he has made, not a specific cookie. So, you use a.) The word "cookie" begins with a consonant sound, so we use a. If the word begins with a vowel sound, we use an. For example: The scientist had an idea.(We do not know anything about the idea, so it is not specific. The word 'idea' starts with a vowel sound, so we use an.) TheWe use the for specific nouns, when we know exactly which thing we are talking about. We use the for singular or plural nouns. For example: Jack fell asleep in the green chair.(We know exactly which specific chair we are talking about.) Eric and Adam are coloring the eggs.(We know exactly which specific eggs we are talking about.) We also use the when there is only one of a thing. For example: The sun is shining today!(There is only one sun.) The vs. A/anThe first time we mention something in a story, we use a/an. After that, we use the.For example: Anna told Rick a secret. The secret was a big surprise! Rick told the secret to Angela later.(We use a the first time we mention the secret. After that, we use the because we know exactly which specific secret we are talking about.) No ArticleRemember that in some cases, we do not use an article. When we are talking about something in general or when we mention a city or country, we do not use an article.For example: Parties are a lot of fun!(Parties in general are fun.) The definite article: the, is used before a noun to indicate that the noun is known to the reader. The indefinite articles: a – an, are used before a noun that is general or not known. In these grammar worksheets, students practice whether to use a, an or the in sentences. Articles are used to indicate the number of singular nouns (a, an) and to specify which noun is being talked about (the). A and an are indefinite articles. They are used to refer to a singular countable noun in general or for the first time. Basic English Grammar rules can be tricky. Exercise on Articles for Class 4 CBSE with Answers PDF There are two types of articles: the definite article (the) and the indefinite articles (a, an). We usually use the indefinite article 'a' 'an', first to mention some person or thing. By doing that, we don't have to be clear about which particular person or thing we are referring to. When we refer to the same person or the thing again, we use the definite article the to indicate the person or the thing already mentioned. There are times when we don't have to use any one of the articles. Such a situation is called zero article, A and An are used to introduce a noun. We use A and An to talk about one person, animal or thing. We use 'A' when the first letter of the noun is a consonant. We use 'An' when the first letter of the noun is a vowel. The is used before special nouns. We use 'A' before u and eu when they sound like Y'. Examples: a uniform, a eucalyptus etc. We use An' before the silent h'. Examples: an Honest, an Hour etc. The is also used before a noun that has been mentioned, introduced or discussed earlier. A and An are indefinite article but 'The' is a definite article. We use the before superlatives. Example: Mt. Everest is the highest peak. We use the before Ordinals, names of the river, lakes, oceans and mountains, names of holy books and newspaper, names of buildings and monuments.
